DISCUSSION OF STATUS OF MEDICAL CLINIC CONTRACT

Mayor O'Brien stated that two medical providers, Northwell and Catholic Health Services, had submitted proposals offering to provide both seasonal medical clinic and seasonal paramedic services to the Village starting in 2025 and going through 2029. Mayor O'Brien stated that the Medical Advisory Committee (MAC) had met with both proposers about the services that they planned to provide. He then he asked MAC Chair Dr. Susan Lipsitz to provide a summary report of those meetings, which included comments from other MAC members. Trustee Kovner, who oversaw the proposal process in her capacity as the Public Health Trustee, then provided her perspective of the process and the comparisons between the two vendors, and also stated that, given the approaching summer season, a final decision on the proposals needed to be made at this meeting. After discussion and all having a chance to be heard, discussion concluded pending further consideration and action later in the meeting.
